Berlin Brothersvalley Elementary School Parent and Family Engagement Policy 2024-2025

PART I. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

The Berlin Brothersvalley School Elementary School agrees to implement the following statutory requirement:

- 1. Consistent with section 1118, the Berlin Brothersvalley Elementary school will ensure that the required school-level parent and family engagement policies meet the requirements of section 1118(b) of the ESEA, and each include, as a component, a school-parent compact consistent with section 1118(d) of the ESEA.

1. The Berlin Brothersvalley Elementary School will take the following actions to involve parents and family members in the joint development of its district wide parent and family engagement plan under section 1112 of the ESEA:

An annual meeting of all parents/guardians shall be held to explain the annual goals and purposes of the Title I program. provided:

- a. Information about programs provided under Title I.
- b. Description and explanation of the curriculum in use, the forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet.
- o. Opportunities to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children.
- d. Opportunities to submit parent/guardian comments about the program to the district level.
- e. A survey will be distributed at the beginning and end of each school year to all parents so they may have the opportunity to provide input in the planning, implementation, and evaluation of the Title I program.
- 3. The Berlin Brothersvalley Elementary School will provide the following necessary coordination, technical assistance, and other support to assist Title I, Part A schools in planning and implementing effective parent and family involvement activities to improve student academic achievement and school performance:
 - -Opportunities shall be provided for parents/guardians to meet with teachers to discuss their child's progress.
 - -Parents/Guardians may be given guidance as to how they can assist at home in the education of their child.
 - -The district will provide information related to school and parent programs, written in a parent friendly format, to all parents through building newsletters, district newsletters, student handbooks, Power School, and the School Performance Profile.
 - -If sufficient, Title I funding may be used to facilitate parent/guardian attendance at meetings through payment of transportation and child care costs.

- 4. The Berlin Brothersvalley Elementary School will coordinate and integrate parent and family engagement strategies in Title I, Part A with parent and family engagement strategies under the following programs: by:

- -Parent conferences scheduled during day and evening times to accommodate parents/guardians.
- -Parent trainings in instructional programs and curriculum.
- -Bingo for Books activities for families to attend.
- -Transitional meetings to occur for new students entering the Kindergarten.
- -A district housed Pre-K Program.
- -Educational field trips sponsored through the Parent-Teacher Organization funding.
- -After school tutoring programs.
- 5. The Berlin Brothersvalley Elementary School will take the following actions to conduct, with the meaningful involvement of parents and family members, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this parent and family engagement policy in improving the academic quality of its Title I, Part A schools. The evaluation will include identifying barriers to greater participation by parents in activities (with particular attention to parents who are economically disadvantaged, are disabled, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy, or are of any racial or ethnic minority background). The evaluation will also include identifying the needs of parents and family members to assist with the learning of their children, including engaging with school personnel and teacher; and strategies to support successful school and family interactions.
